**The following issues were discussed after a short introduction and welcome
by Co convenor Greg Vaughan.**

**Distribution of Flyers for Precinct Meeting -only two residents reported
that they had received a notice for meeting. Questions were raised as to
how this could be improved .**

Development Issues

**Concern was expressed about a development at 6 Collingwood St. which
residents believed would affect both the streetscape, the street having a
heritage conservation status , and the rear building line which was well
over the allowable by 8metres . It also exceeded height restrictions.**

The following motions were passed

MOTION 1

**Background .There were considerable concerns regarding 13 Calga Ave. and
Council not responding to a FOI request over issues raised in connection with
that DA.**

**BBPrecinct requests that the Freedom of Information requested for 13 Calga
Ave. is formally acted on as a matter of urgency.**

Proposer Sally Bassett Seconder Jacqlyn Parkes Talbot. Passed unanimously.

MOTION 2

**Background -There was concern expressed about the proliferation of cats in
our Precinct area and not only the harm they cause to our wildlife with a
number of residents noting they had found dead birds and ringtail possums in
their gardens. One resident has been unable to leave her windows open as
cats having been invading her house and excreting on her floors.**

**It was noted that the RSPCA had recommended Cat control at night and the
A.C.T has introduced cat controls at night .**

**BBPrecinct requests that Waverley Council considers requiring cat owners to
keep their cats indoors at night from sunrise to sunset
and investigate enforcement options such as registration.**

Proposer Susan Hely seconder Sally Bassett .Passed unanimously.
