What's happening in the Lawson Ward



Boot Factory Upgrade

The countdown is on to the opening of the Boot Factory building in Bondi Junction! We have transformed the former shoemaking factory at 27-33 Spring Street into a community facility and future home to our first Thinker in Residence pilot program.

Charing Cross Streetscape Upgrade

We're upgrading the Charing Cross business precinct to improve the area's economic and social vibrancy and make it safer, more accessible and sustainable. Bulk electrical works have begun as part of our streetscape upgrade, which will take around six months to complete. At time of print, we are preparing to appoint a contractor to: install wider footpaths, a new raised pedestrian crossing, improve options for outdoor dining and new street trees, and the integration of EV chargers. Please continue to support local business which will remain open during works.



Bronte Surf Life Saving Club update

It's all systems go for the Bronte Surf Life Saving Club redevelopment after the revised Development Application [DA-455/2022] was approved. Waverley Council is delighted that the project has reached this milestone and look forward to working in partnership with the club and architects, Warren and Mahoney, to see the new building and facilities come to life.

What's happening in the Hunter Ward

Clifftop Walkway Upgrade

Waverley Council is upgrading and improving the safety of Clifftop Walkway (Eastern Reserve, Dover Heights and Diamond Bay Reserve). In May, Council voted to progress the project as per the approved development application. At time of print, construction work for the boardwalk and lookout are about to recommence and will take about four months. Works have commenced at Eastern Reserve, including emergency stormwater priority upgrades at George Street and Ocean View Avenue. This project is proudly co-funded through the NSW Government's Public Spaces Legacy Program and Waverley Council.



Eastern Reserve Pumping Station

Sydney Water is building new infrastructure to divert the flows from ocean outfalls in Sydney to the Bondi Resource Recovery Facility. The Refresh Vaucluse Diamond Bay project is currently being designed and options are being considered for the new pump station in Eastern Reserve. The Council is working closely with Sydney Water to consider the impacts on residents, the community and the environment before any works begin.

South Head Cemetery plan of management

South Head Cemetery, Vaucluse is a place of historical significance. As heritage-listed Crown land, a Plan of Management (PoM) is required. Council recently exhibited the draft PoM for community feedback on this valued place of remembrance in our community.

Curlewis St Streetscape Upgrade

Our streetscape upgrade of Curlewis Street, Bondi Beach, from Campbell Parade to Old South Head Road is progressing, with the first few substages of works between Campbell Parade and Glenayr Avenue now almost complete. The project aims to make the area safer and more enjoyable to visit and promotes active transport by providing a separated two-way bike path from Campbell Parade to Wellington Street, shared paths for pedestrians and bike riders, raised pedestrian crossings, more trees and plantings, multifunction poles and six new electric vehicle charging stations. Remaining works in the first stage are expected to be completed by early August. This project is proudly funded by NSW Government in association with Waverlev Council.



Gould St Street Party

Join us on Saturday 20 July from 11am to 4pm for our first ever Gould St Street Party! Made possible through support from NSW Government's Open Streets Program, Gould St Street Party is a new, all-inclusive addition to our 2024 Bondi Festival program. We recently sought Expressions of Interest (EOI) from emerging and established artists, performers and entertainers to be a part of this all-ages event. Check out incredible local talent alongside local brewers, shopping pop ups, makers' workshops and an array of eats and beats in the heart of Bondi.

Tamarama Surf Club Upgrade

The Tamarama Surf Club upgrade project is in its final stages! The upgrade will provide new and improved amenities to cater for lifesaving, public education and engagement needs within the community. This project is part funded by the Australian Government.

Scott Street Reserve Playground Upgrade

We're planning a beautiful upgrade of the playground at Scott Street Reserve, Bronte. Our proposed improvements will provide new play experiences, whilst retaining the site's "pocket park" character. Care has been taken to consider neighbouring properties, the retention of mature trees, and existing services.

Long-term Winter Licences for Waverley Community Sporting Facilities

Waverley Council is establishing winter long-term licences for up to five years for the sporting facilities at Waverley Park (and Hugh Bamford Reserve), ensuring that Council's limited facilities are equitably and transparently shared among sporting clubs and organisations. Shortlisted applicants have been invited to formally apply.

Miller Street Upgrade, Bondi

We're proposing to create a safer space for all road users in Miller Street, as well as a more vibrant streetscape for the community to enjoy. We asked the community for feedback on two design options and we will keep you updated on the outcome.

from NSW Government, we will be rolling out another 51 EV charging ports across our LGA.

The sun is setting on Solar my School

After 7 successful years, the Council-run Solar my School program, which has helped hundreds of schools across New South Wales install solar power, is heading off into the sunset.

In total, 122 schools installed solar through this Council-run program, collectively representing a remarkable 5.9 megawatts of solar capacity. This is equivalent to powering 1.300 Australian homes and will contribute to reducing 6,520 tonnes of carbon emissions per year!

The success of the program led to it being expanded to 13 other LGAs around NSW and was the recipient of many awards for leadership and design, including NSW Green Globes, Cities Power Partnerships and LG Professionals Association National Award.

Bondi Festival is our winter celebration of local artists, immersive performances and playful offerings for audiences of all ages.



2024 Mark & Evette Moran Nib Literary Award

With a major prize of \$40,000, Mark & Evette Moran Nib Literary Award is Waverley Council's annual celebration of the best in Australian research-based literature. Submissions are judged on literary merit, quality research, readability and value to the community. Other prizes on offer include the Nib People's Choice Prize (\$4,000) and the Alex Buzo Shortlist Prize (6 x \$1,500). Nominees will be eagerly awaiting 8 August when the 2024 long list is announced. All winners will be announced at a public event on 27 November.
